Haynes Public Charter School is seeking current and retired teachers, educators and coaches to lead semester-long **Fall** (August 24th - January 22nd) and **Spring** (January 25th - June 10th) **Elective classes**. Electives are offered to students attending the after-school program Monday through Thursday.

BACKGROUND

E.L. Haynes Public Charter School, located in Northwest Washington, D.C. is seeking dynamic individuals to lead classes in our exceptional Extended Day Program. Positions are ideal for creative individuals seeking a career in education or those who have a deep interest in, love for, and commitment to working with children in Pre-Kindergarten through 7th grade.

Named after Dr. Euphemia Lofton Haynes, a D.C. teacher and the first African-American woman to receive a doctorate in mathematics, E.L. Haynes serves a diverse body of students throughout the District of Columbia.

QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must have graduated from an accredited institution and have experience working with children. Preferred applicants will have teaching experience—whether in a classroom, camp or after-school setting where planning was involved.

Positions are part-time and run from 2:45/4:00 pm – 6:00 pm (M-TH). Classes for 4th through 7th grade students meet twice a week either Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday. Electives for 2nd & 3rd grade students rotate between classrooms daily (M-TH). Applicants are encouraged to apply to teach more than one rotation or grade level. Friday teaching possibilities are also available. Please ask for more information if interested.

Qualified applicants will be asked to submit a proposal for a semester-long class. Selected applicants will be required to submit formal lesson plans and incorporate developmentally appropriate curricular expectations.

Areas of particular interest include, but are not limited to:

- **Foreign languages** (other than Spanish)
- **Athletics & Fitness** (seasonal sports, step team, swimming)
- **Visual Arts** (painting, drawing, film, photography)
- **Performance Arts** (theater, drama, dance)

- **Other student groups & organizations** (debate team, Future Problem Solvers of America, Literature Club, chess club, service learning club)
