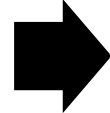

The state of schools in our city



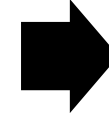
Fewer than

Student demographics



- 54% of our students are African-American
- 25% Latino
- 18% Caucasian
- 3% Asian

- 62% of Haynes students qualify for free or reduced lunch
- 21% are English Language Learners

While 60% of Haynes students come from Ward 1 (neighborhoods closest to the school), we have students from every Ward in the city.

E.L. Haynes will be a model of educational excellence and make a lasting impact on urban education in Washington, DC and across the nation.

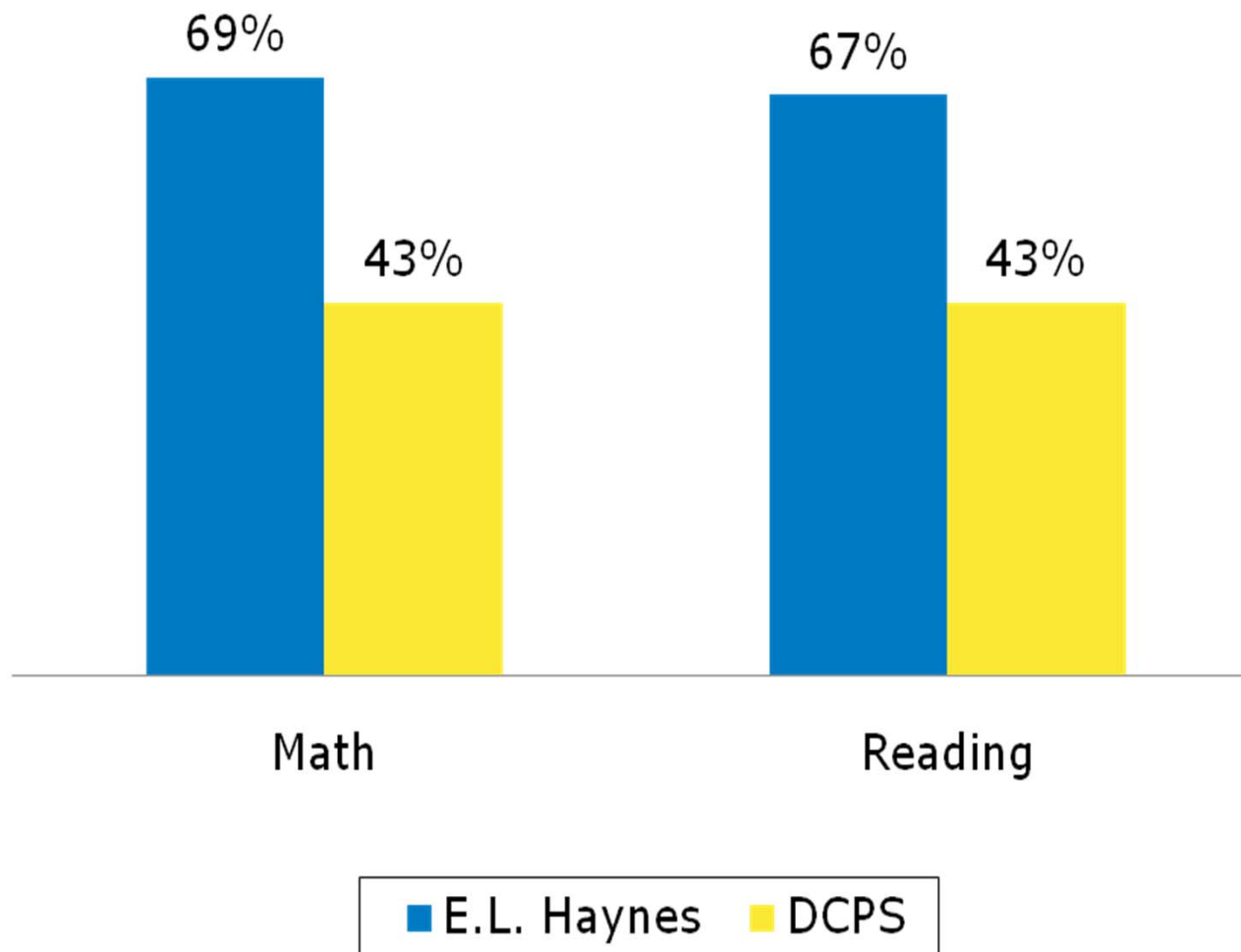
Our Mission

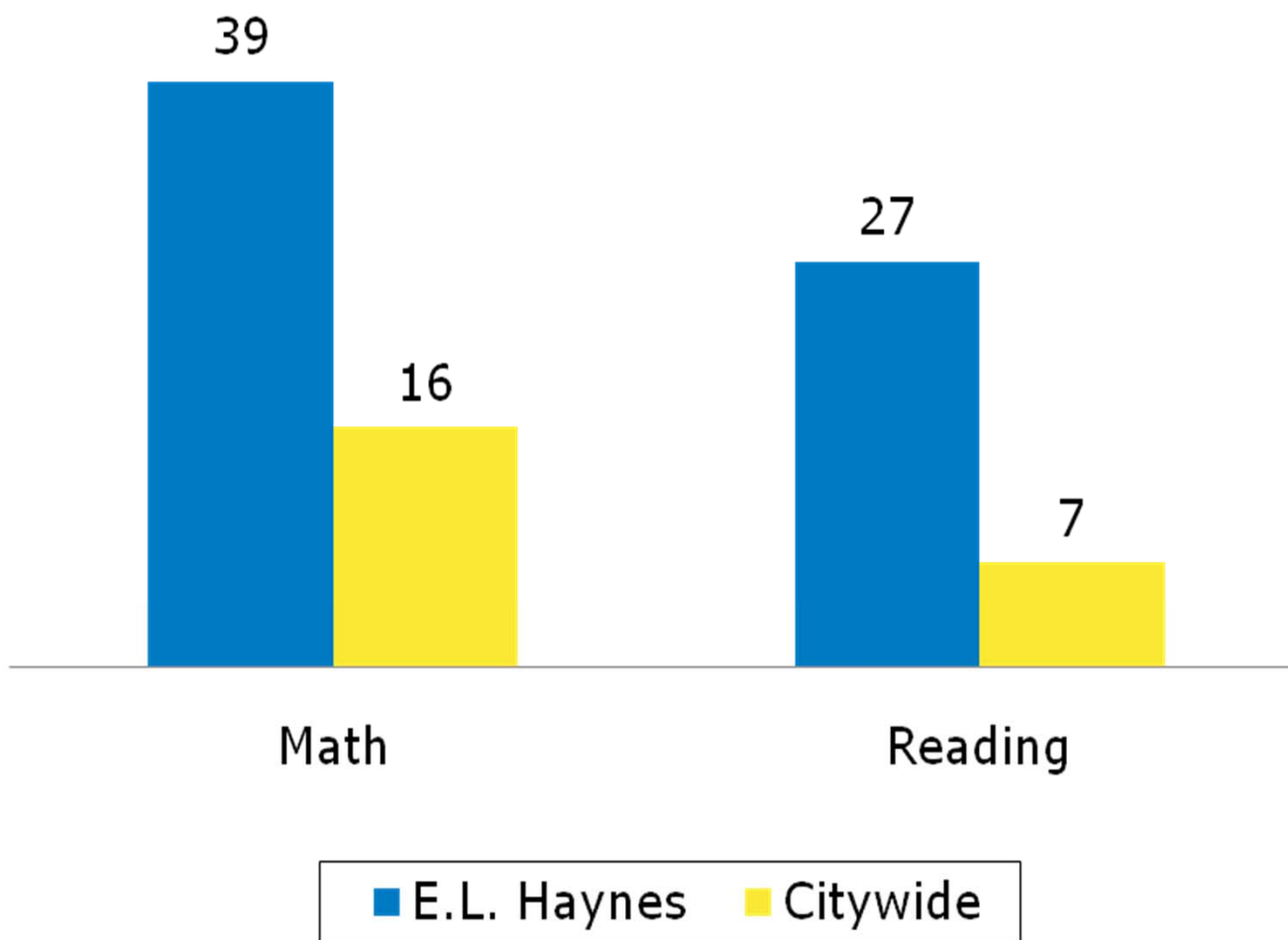
Students Scoring Proficient or Advanced on 2010 DC CAS



Extraordinary Four-Year Gains



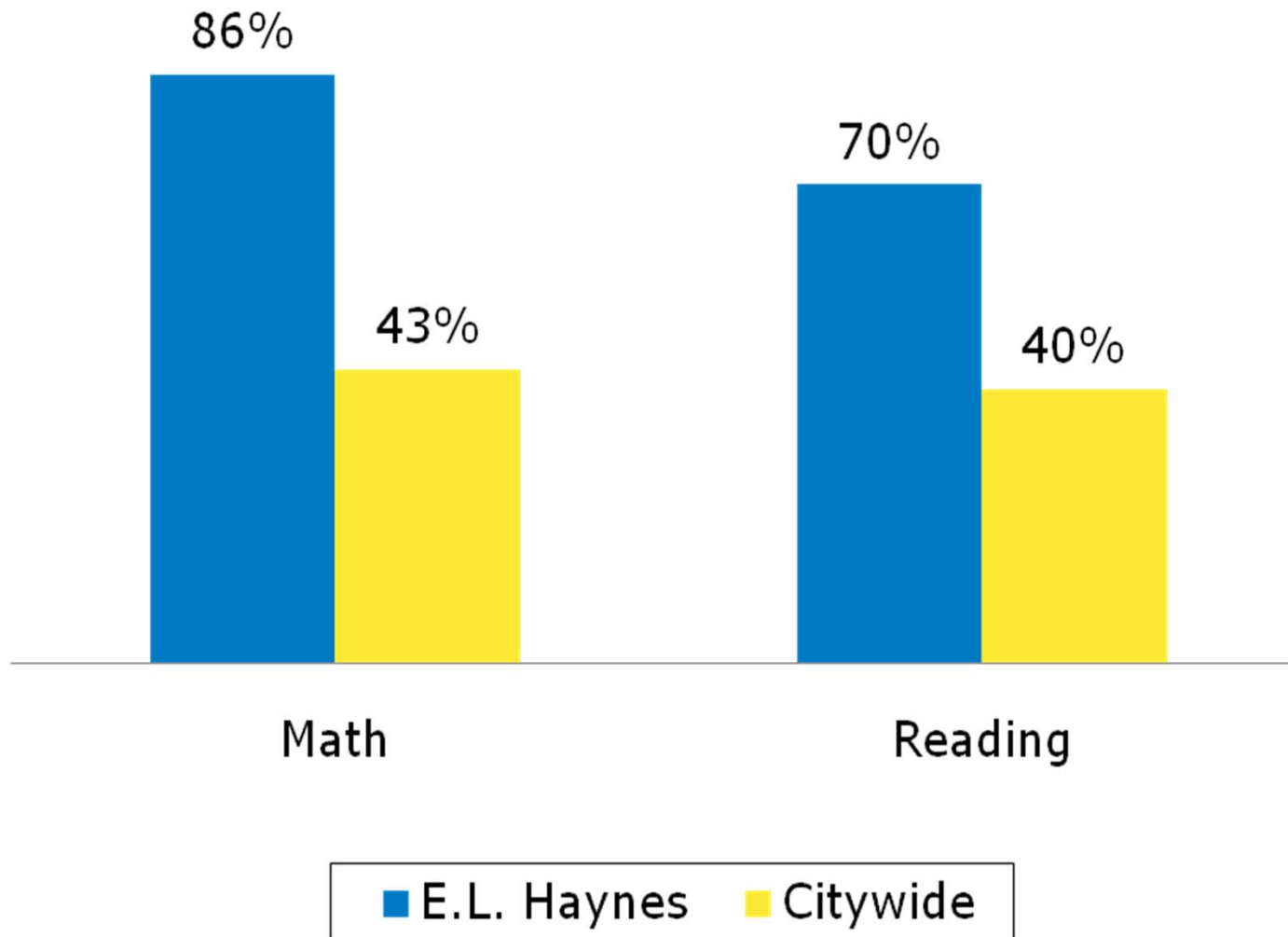
Percentage Points Gains in Proficiency on DC CAS, 2006-2010

Nationally Recognized as Model of Educational Excellence



- ▶ For the **third year in a row**, E.L. Haynes won the **Silver-Gain Award** through New Leader for New Schools' Effective Practice Incentive Community grant program.
- ▶ In 2010, E.L. Haynes ranked **3rd** in a consortium of 109 charter schools nationwide based on two-year student gains.

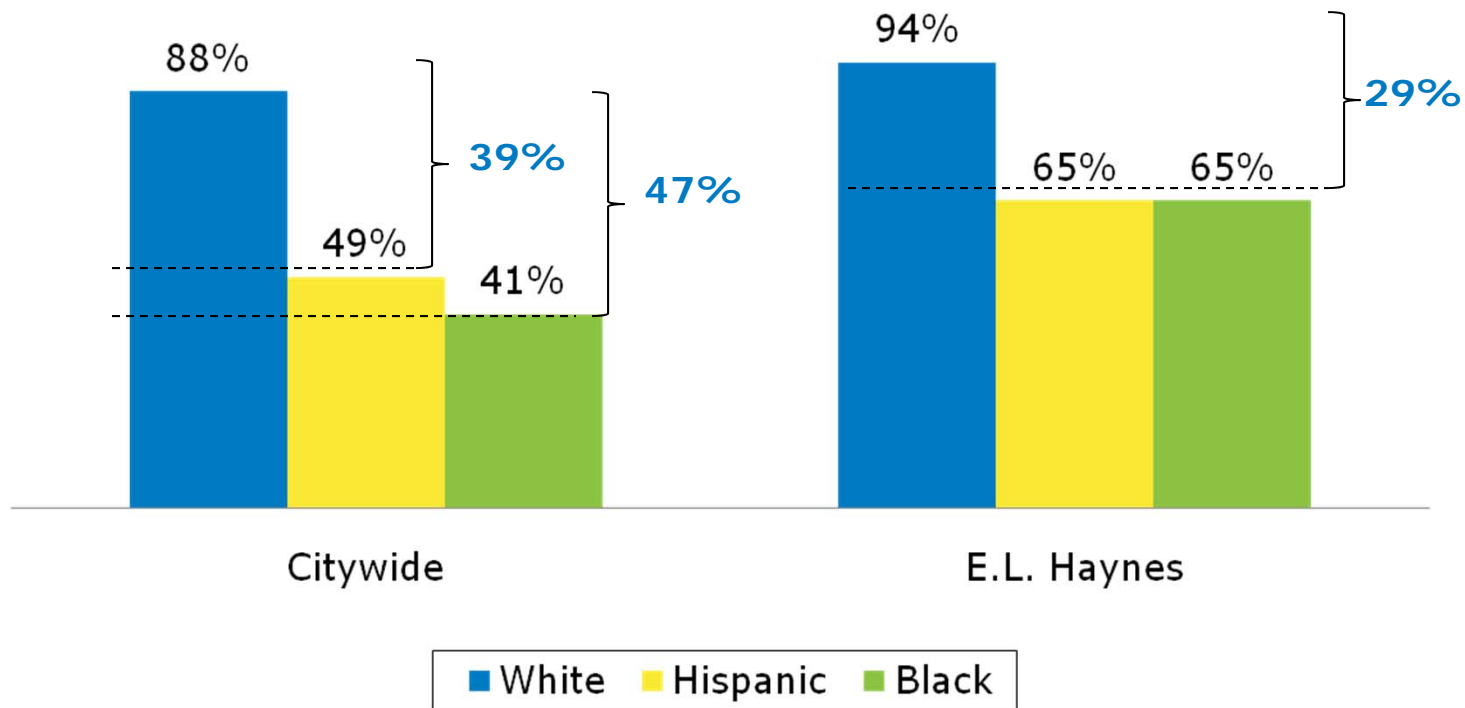


Narrowing the Racial Achievement Gap



- ▶ E.L. Haynes is narrowing the city's racial achievement gap – by **18 percentage points** for black students and **10 percentage points** for Hispanic students.
- ▶ At E.L. Haynes, black students score **24 percentage points** higher than the average black student in DC; Hispanic students score **16 percentage points** higher.

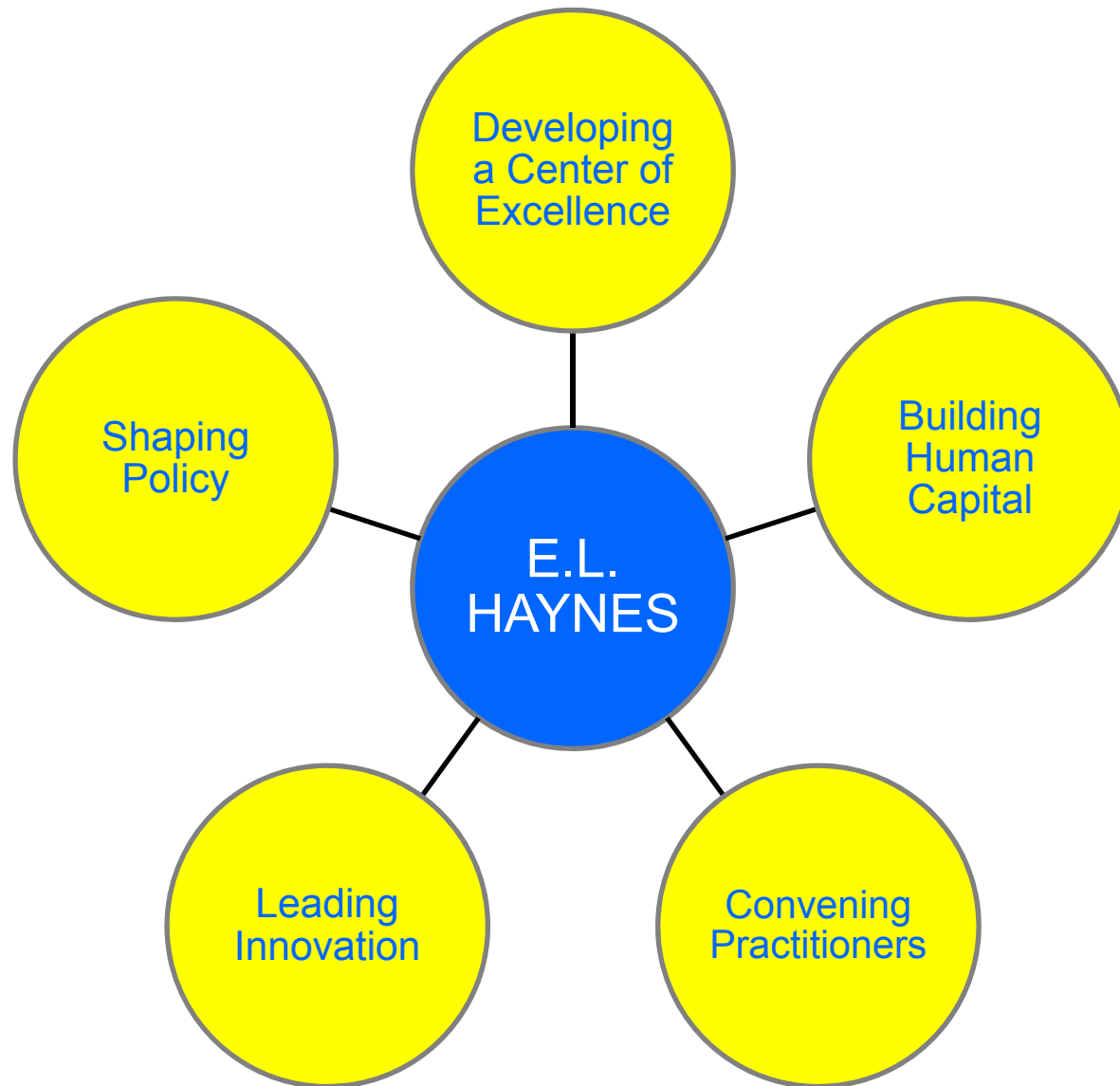
